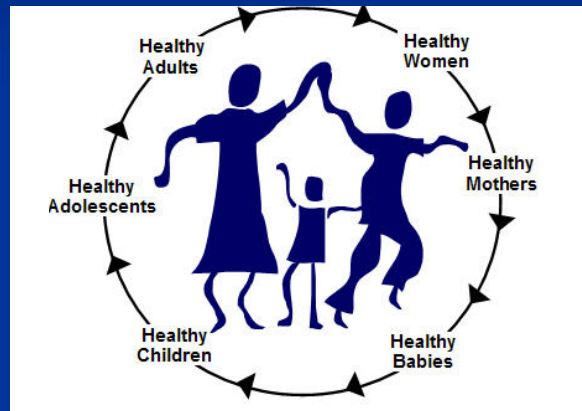

 Values: Like other state departments, MDCH has the values of integrity, excellence, inclusion and teamwork, and a value unique to our department – compassion.



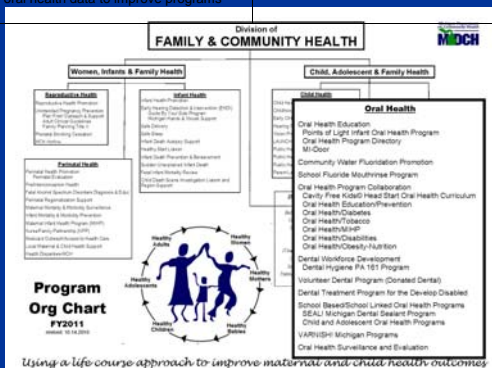

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Increase preconception health for women and men Increase planned pregnancies, decrease unintended pregnancies Increase male involvement in family planning Increase access to high-quality, effective contraception and reproductive services for low-income citizens in Michigan Eliminate disparities in reproductive and preconception health outcomes 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Increase the interconception health of women including prenatal and postnatal Reduce infant mortality and morbidity Reduce maternal mortality and morbidity Eliminate disparities in infant and maternal birth outcomes Implement, support and evaluate a system of perinatal optimization Increase the use of a medical home for women, particularly of child bearing age Reduce untreated maternal depression Increase maternal/child attachment for all women who give birth in Michigan Increase successful maternal health management for both women and their infants, including effective engagement in appropriate services and supports, particularly for women identified as being at-risk due to socioeconomic determinants of health Increase screening for maternal alcohol use and implement prevention strategies to decrease the number of women who drink alcohol during pregnancy 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Reduce infant deaths Reduce racial disparity in infant mortality Increase the percentage of infants who are put to sleep using safe sleep practices Increase the proportion of mothers who breastfeed their babies Provide screening and evidence-based treatment for known health conditions in newborns Increase the proportion of newborns/infants that have hearing screens conducted no later than one month of age, audiologic evaluation for hearing loss no later than 3 months of age and are enrolled in appropriate intervention services no later than 6 months of age 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Improve child wellness to achieve optimal functioning across all domains of development Increase family ability to understand and promote child wellness Support the development of an integrated, comprehensive early childhood system at both state and local levels that spans a wide range of public/private organizations, services and resources and includes prevention, protection, and intervention activities Collect and analyze outcome data to improve systems, service outcomes Increase access to care and use of a medical home for children and their families Eliminate disparities in child health outcomes 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Improve the health, developmental and socio-emotional growth of adolescents and young adults Improve access to care and use of a medical home for adolescents and young adults Support identification of health, developmental and socio-emotional concerns, through an integrated adolescent system at both state and local levels that spans public/private organizations, services and resources Provide all school aged children and youth in Michigan with medically accurate information and best practices around health promotion and skill development in order to inform and support healthy life-style decisions Increase access to mental health information and services Promote healthy and informed decision-making around sexual health, including preconception health Support parents in understanding adolescent health issues and supporting their youth in responsible choices about health behaviors Reduce health disparities among school aged youth Increase the number of adolescents who have incorporated health/lifestyle behaviors, including chronic disease management into their lives as they transition into adulthood

ORAL HEALTH

- Decrease dental disease across the lifespan through access to optimally fluoridated water
 - Increase number of community water systems with optimal levels of community water fluoridation
 - Increase well water fluoride level testing
 - Monitor safety of fluoride levels in all community water systems
- Support preventive dental services such as sealants and fluoride, as part of a dental benefits package by third party payors
 - Increase awareness of preventive services across the lifespan
 - Increase educational efforts in oral health
- Support scientific evidence and evidence-based practices for oral health policy initiatives and programs
 - Provide technical assistance to programs and organizations
 - Promote and implement goals of the State Oral Health Plan
 - Aggregate and evaluate oral health data to improve programs and key outcomes
- Support dental home development as part of medical home development
 - Coordinate the development of MDCH definition of dental home
 - Increase collaboration with medical home partners
- Support improving access to dental care across the lifespan for all residents of MI
 - Support expansion of dental workforce
 - Increase number of school-based dental clinics
 - Increase utilization of non-dental healthcare professionals
- Increase oral disease prevention through school-based dental sealant programs
 - Support additional funding to increase number of Michigan children with sealants
